# TESTIMONIES OF GRACE



AshLynn Romero was baptized on February 23, 2025.

"Growing up, I went to church on Sundays, went to youth group on Wednesday nights, and would even attend Vacation Bible School and Bible camps. I went through all the motions of being a Christian, but I lived very lukewarm.

"My characteristics would change depending on who I was around, where I was, and who was listening. I knew the Word of God and who God was, but chose not to follow or listen because I wasn't ready to give up the things that were giving me temporary fulfillment.

"Being a lukewarm Christian was eating me alive. It was a battle between flesh, and knowing who Jesus really is. I got to a point where I was so drained. I was tired of questioning where I stood with God, and I was tired of having a heart so empty but acting like it was full.

"God so graciously convicted me and humbled me before Him. I knew I could only have permanent joy and eternal life through Him and Him alone. My heart was longing for Him.

"I remember begging God for forgiveness and salvation. And it is by His grace that He gave me just that. Because I now know the Lord, I can truly say that before, when I thought I knew God, I didn't truly understand His love for me, His patience, and His mercy. That mercy has never failed me." •



Tristen Romero was baptized on February 23, 2025.

"I grew up knowing and believing in our Lord Jesus Christ, but I didn't consistently go to church or fully dedicate my life to Him. I was too distracted from Him by focusing on worldly living and filling up my heart with only temporary happiness.

"I was doing the good works: I was kind, I was caring, I was patient, but all of that meant nothing because that was not what was going to make me close to God. Those good works are not what was going to get me into heaven.

"One summer night I was talking to the Lord and felt so convicted for living the way I was living, with no purpose and with no salvation. I asked the Lord to save me from my sins and from the life I was living.

"My wife and I have been attending Indian Hills for a little over two years

now. Watching baptisms and hearing other testimonies has shown me how important baptism is as a follower of Christ. I want to get baptized to show my love for the Lord and His love for me. I want to show that through God's grace I have turned away from my past life and that I am confident in where I will go when my time on earth is done." •



Connor Prusak was baptized on February 23, 2025.

"In my early years, I was loosely raised Catholic, actively participating through first communion and then afterwards only attending on major holidays.

"Fast forward several years, I had graduated from college, landed a full-time job, found an apartment, and was free from depression. At the time, I took credit for all the victories in my life and justified any failures with external excuses.

"Yet, if I was truly honest with myself, I was struggling more than ever. Despite all my achievements, I was a slave to my sins, and the fleeting fixes of life—whether vices, accomplishments, or distractions—left me empty.

"In early 2022, a coworker invited me to a ministry called Alpha Omega.

Although I didn't start attending until the summer, when I did, I engaged in many deep conversations about faith, convictions, and Christian fundamentals. I received great answers, but I still wrestled with unanswered questions about what it truly meant to live as a believer.

"Then, one week in October, something changed. I remember reading Romans 12, and it felt like I was truly understanding what I was reading —how we are to live as servants acceptable to God, renewed daily to the will of God, using our given gifts for the benefit of the body, loving what is good, hating what is evil, investing in one another, and doing all through the power of the Spirit with respect and honor. That night I prayed to turn away from my sin, accepting the free gift of salvation that God provided, knowing it was not because of anything I had done, but solely through Jesus' complete payment on the cross at Calvary.

"It's been two years since I asked Jesus to be the Lord and Savior of my life and my walk continues to progress. I make a conscious effort to be in the Word and in prayer daily, and I regularly attend Indian Hills and its ministries to foster spiritual growth and community. My confidence has been renewed, especially when facing trials that would otherwise overwhelm me. I've seen positive changes in my life growing in sanctification and shedding

old sinful habits. Above all, my deepest desire is to know the Lord more intimately every day, to draw wisdom from His Word, and to live in a way that brings glory to Him. All thanks and praise be to God." •



Johanna Roux was baptized on February 23, 2025.

"From a young age I can recall attending the Hills and being in various activities in the church. I understood the gospel and what it took for salvation but only saw it as being a part of my weekly routine.

"As I progressed and moved on to middle school, I quickly lost my 'church kid'act and followed the world. I believed in self-love, self-satisfaction, and the euphoric state of substances. I see now what the world offered was not what it appeared to be. Self-love was self-harm, self-satisfaction was

discontent, and the euphoric state was a disguise for the miserable life of sin I lived in.

"I continued attending church activities to please my family. In high school I floated around friend groups and would adapt to their morals and lifestyles. By my junior year I felt the intense weight of my spiritual death.

"I had friends at the time who claimed to be a part of the new-age gospel of 'I believe I'm a sinner and Christ died on the cross but there is no need for change in my sinful life. This struck a hard core of conviction.

"My junior-going-into-senior year of camp I counted the cost and could no longer find what I thought was satisfaction in my sinful life and prayed the sinner's prayer. I instantly found the peace and joy I had been searching after for years. I can say that it is truly by God's grace I am a new creation and I seek after Him daily." •

Natalie Snyder was baptized on February 23, 2025.

"I have always gone to church and was raised with Christian values. On the outside, I looked like every other church kid. In reality, I wasn't saved.

"I knew that I needed to be saved, but didn't want to make the commitment. I didn't think I had any major struggles or a need for a relationship with God.


"When I was 9, I started to experience severe anxiety and anxiety attacks. I would describe it as feeling extremely scared, but not knowing what I was scared of. Philippians 4:7 says, 'And the peace of God which

surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.'I didn't have that kind of peace.

"Over time, my anxiety got progressively worse. There were times I wished I had never been born because I didn't know how I could have peace. I didn't want to die, because I knew I would go to hell, but I also didn't want to live, because I was constantly in a state of fear.

"I remember one night I was feeling overwhelmingly scared. My parents walked me through the Gospel and I prayed with them and asked Jesus to forgive my sins. I realized that I couldn't live without God in my life and that I needed to turn away from sin. After praying that night, I immediately felt the weight of anxiety lifted off of me.

"The peace that God gave me had nothing to do with my circumstances, and everything to do with Him. God has not only given me supernatural peace, but also a desire to grow closer to Him in my relationship with Him." •
